The EIAMD operational capability would be phased in as each site completes construction, testing, and final system checks of the installed components. Following final construction, testing,

and final system-wide checks, the EIAMD system would become fully operational.

the Commander, Navy Region Marianas, the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, and the Guam Historic Preservation Officer, Regarding Navy Undertakings on the Island of Guam (2008) to fulfill Section 106 responsibilities and to avoid, minimize, and/or mitigate effects on historic properties.
